**Major Mandy Lambert, CJM**, has served with the Prince William-Manassas Regional Adult Detention Center for 33 years. She is currently the Director of Support Services and an agency PREA Coordinator. She oversaw a 200-bed expansion project and is in the preliminary stages of another 200-bed expansion project. She was also instrumental in the execution of an Objective Jail Classification System in her facility. Major Lambert is the project manager for the implementation of a Jail-Based Crisis Intervention Team. She is a State-certified General Instructor. She has also been a technical resource provider for National Institute of Corrections since 2005; providing assistance and training on Classification, Housing and Inmate Behavior Management.

**Peter Perroncello, CJM, MS, CCHP, CCT**, is currently in his 37th year of public safety service.
